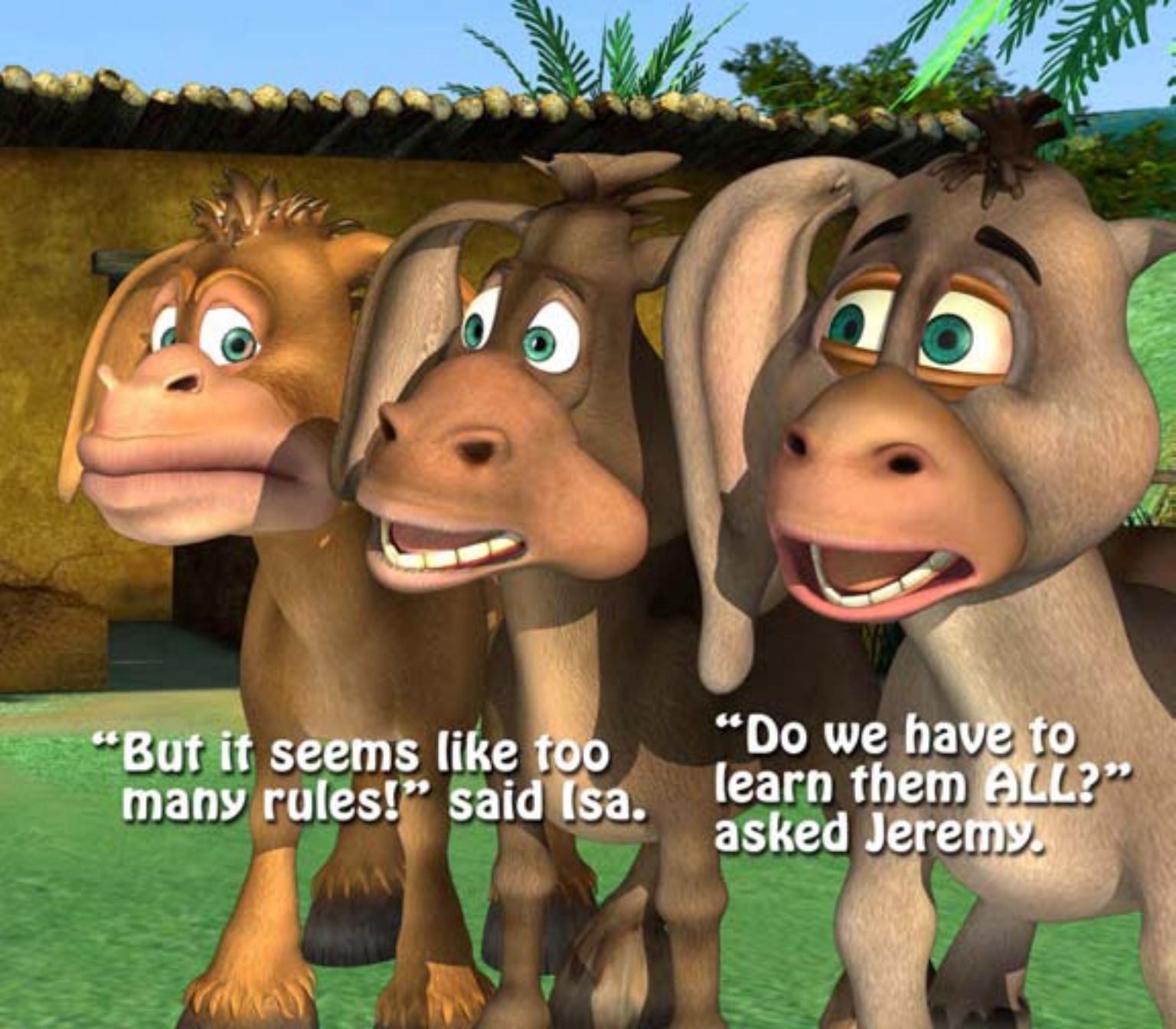

asked Farmer John.**




