asked Farmer John.**




**“That’s just murder!

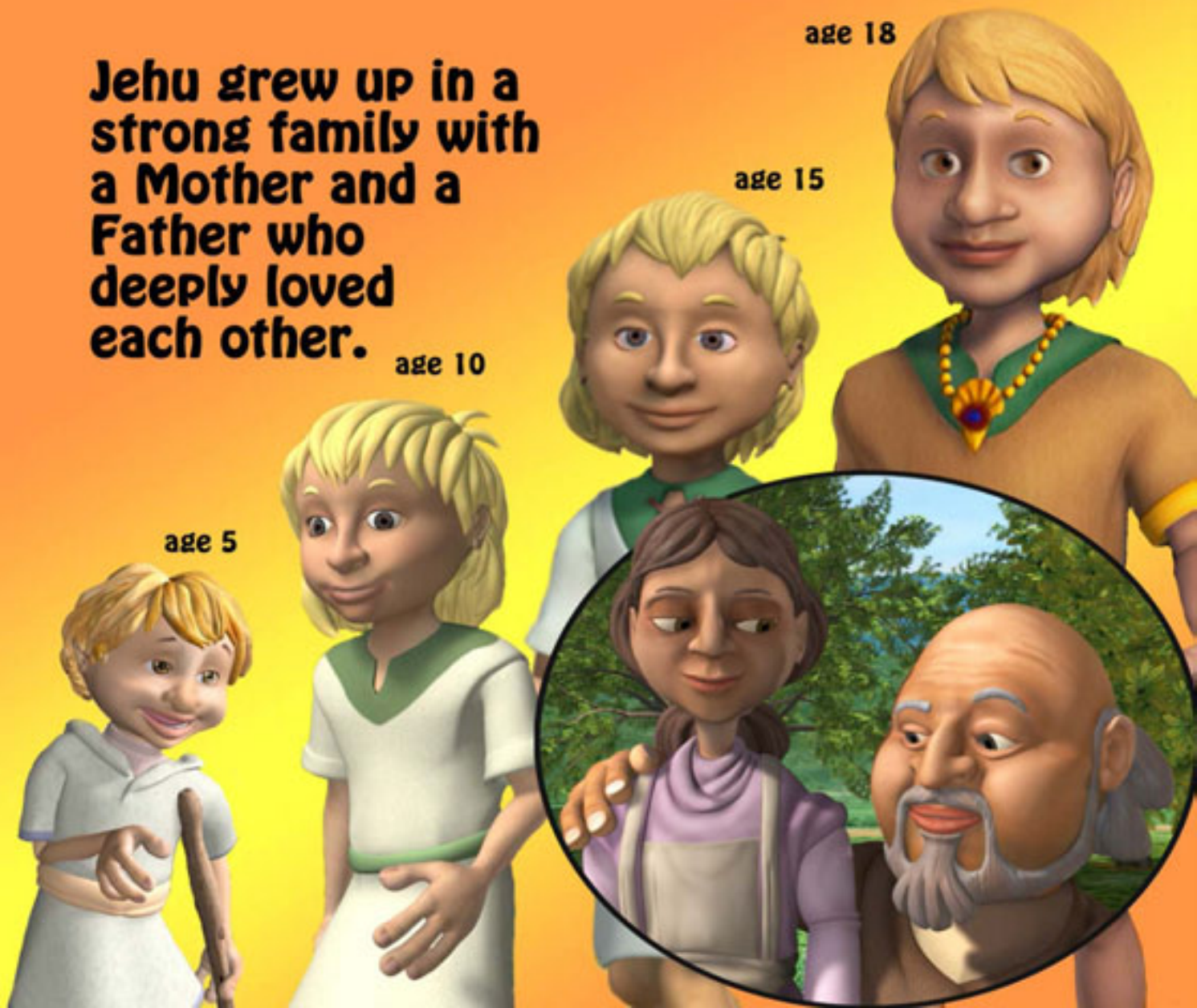

Ollie could see how devoted Jehu was to Allondra. He was happy for them.






Farmer John was very

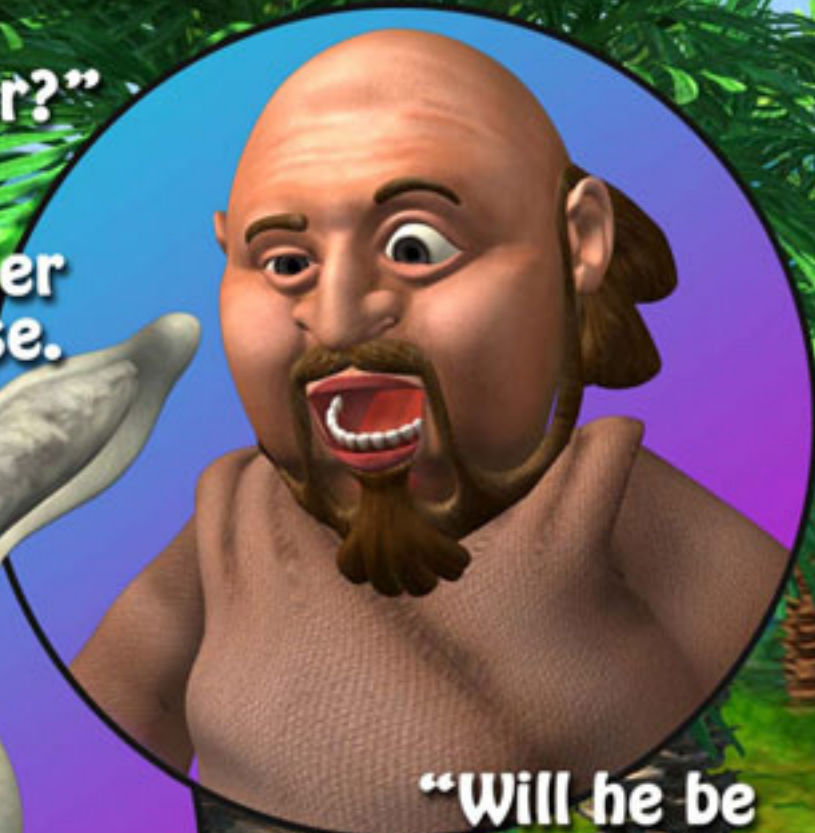

they didn't.**

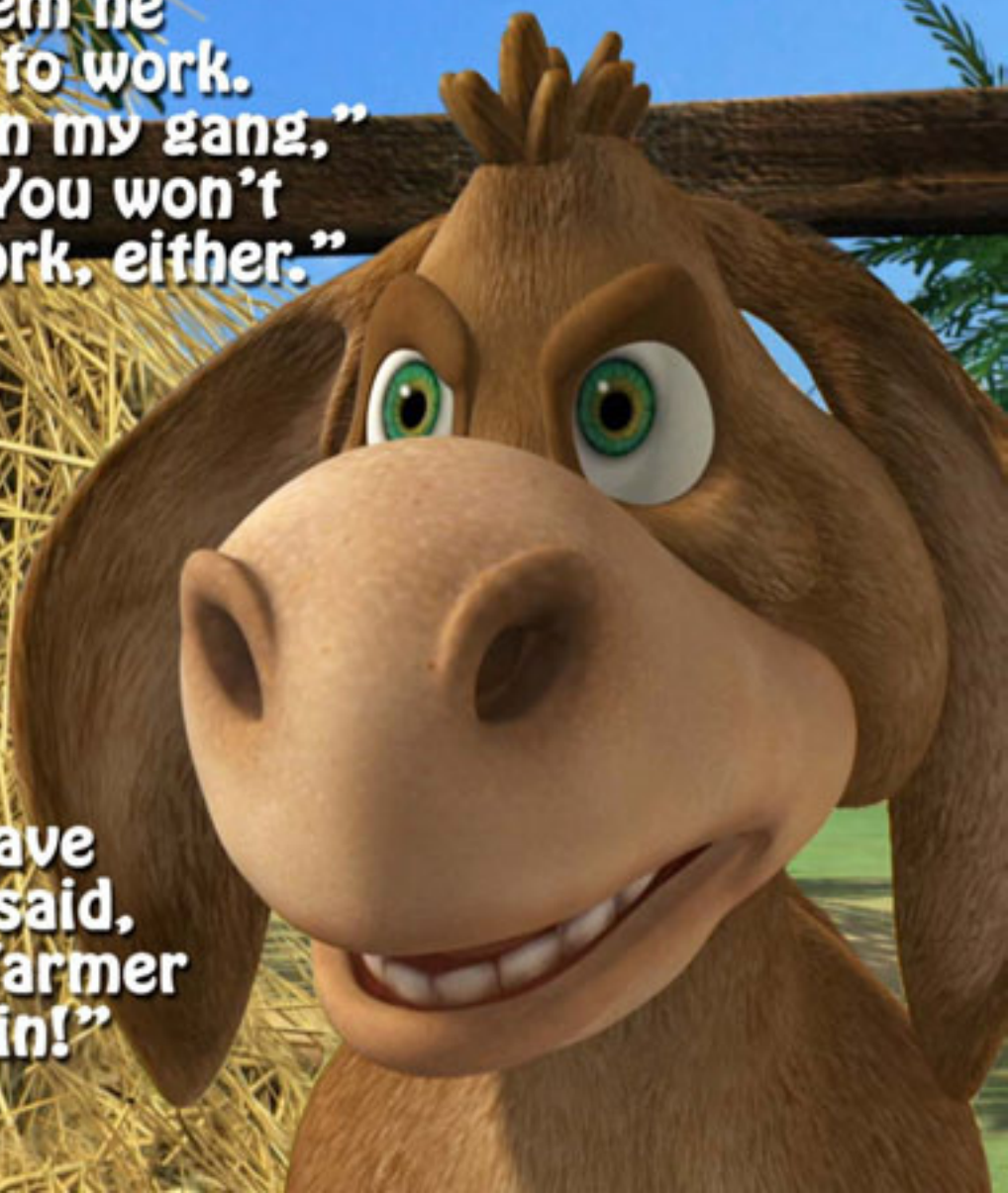
**A wild donkey named

**... they stole Farmer John's grain!**

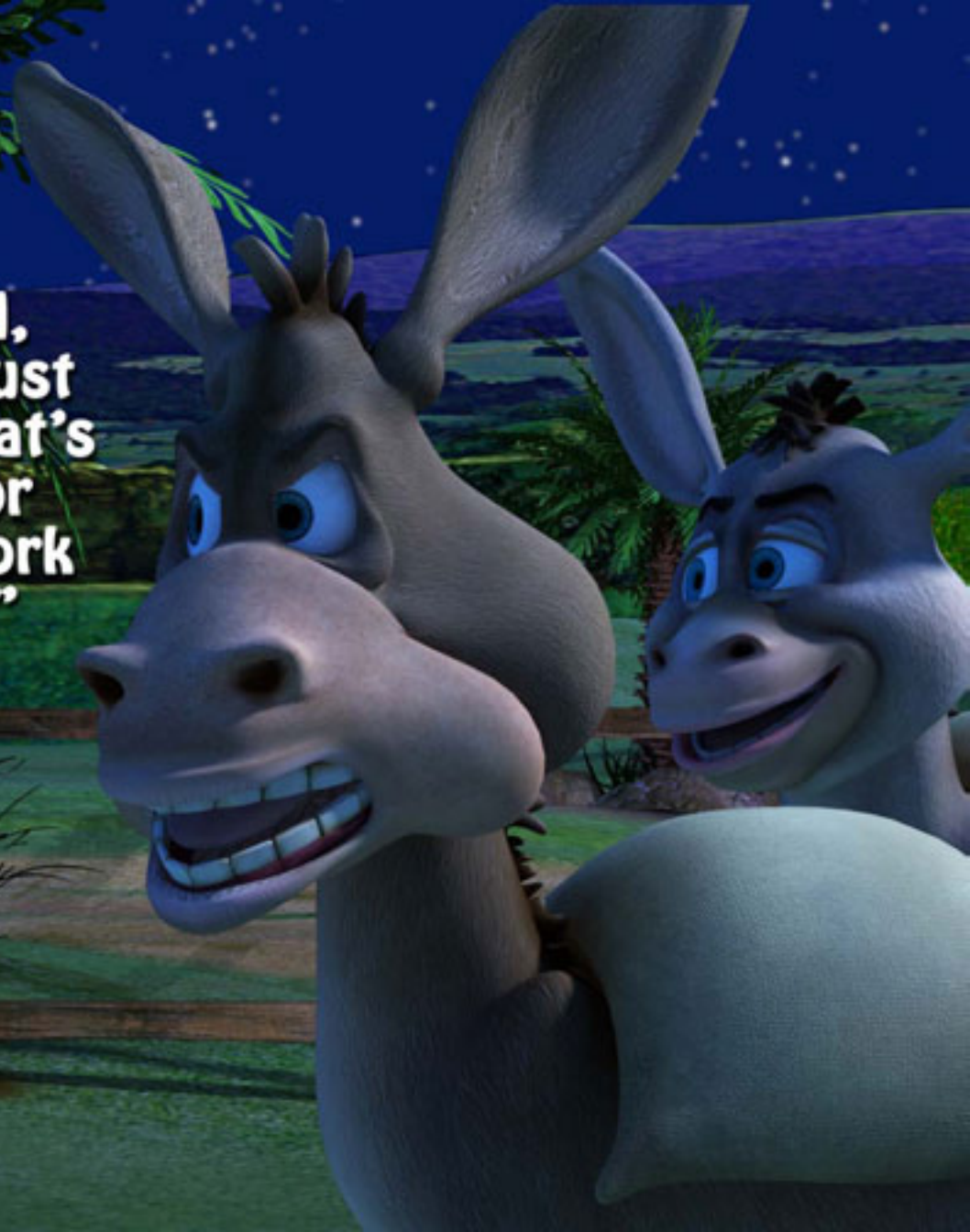

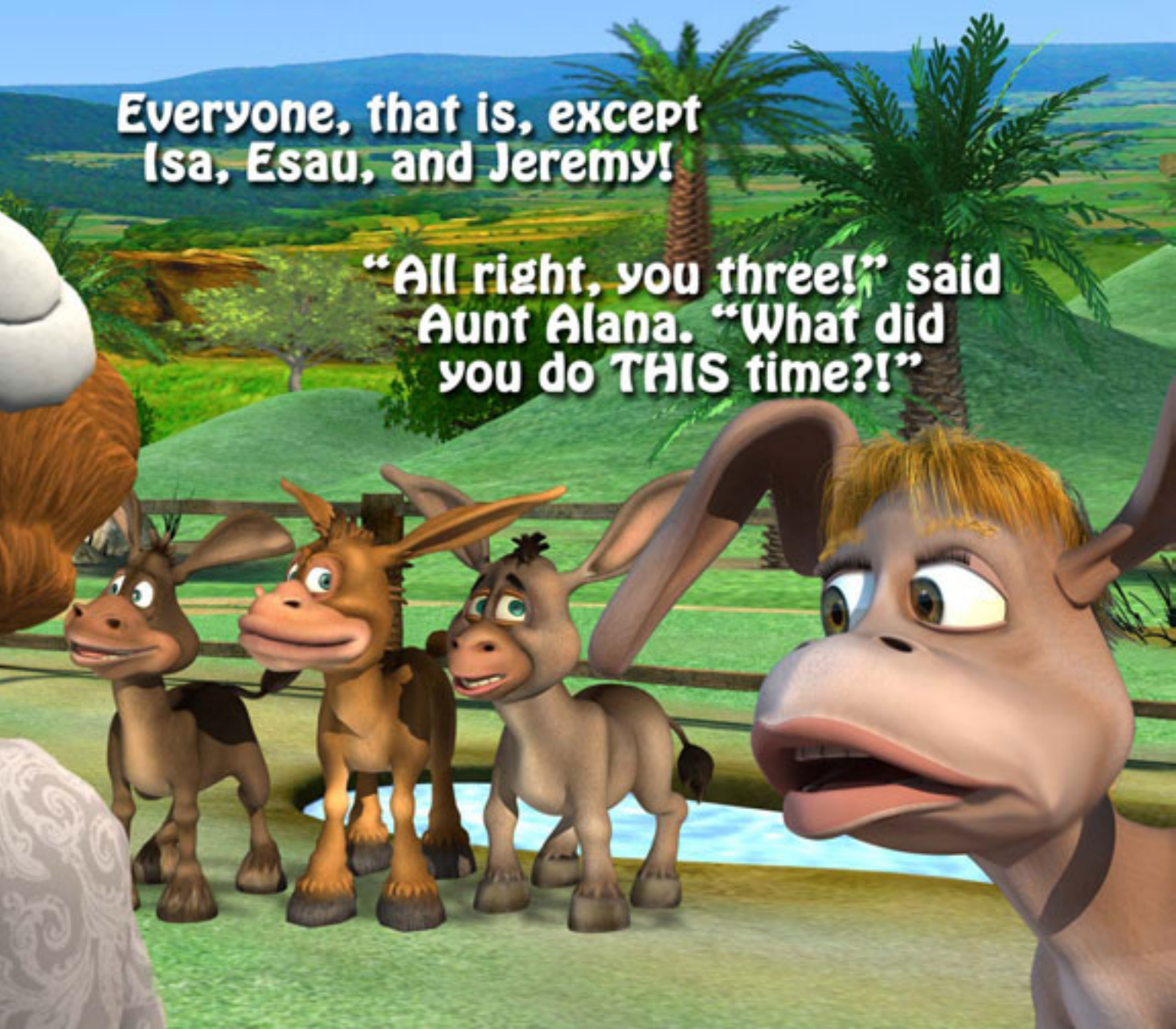
