

“Does God have a name?”






“There are so many ways to think about God, that one name just wouldn’t be enough,” said Aunt Alana.

“What a good idea!” said Aunt Alana.





who fed us!” said Esau.**





**“Yes,” said Ollie.

"Sometimes you hear Him out loud."







“Yeah!” said Esau and Isa.




“Okay,” said Ollie.

and he did!”






“ Saul, who was a leader of the temple, had Stephen arrested for breaking the temple rules.”




**“Stephen was tried and





“Let’s go ask Farmer John for help.”


“But it hurts,

are good."






**"You are right, Farmer John,"

“When we had to fight in the coliseum, Smoothfeather the seagull and his friends brought food to the hungry lions so they wouldn’t eat US!”




"It really saved our lives!"






